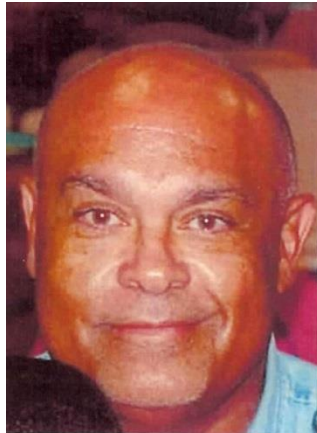


## Thoughts from the brotherhood of Brother Dr. Clarence Bibby
